Remembering John

John Earl Ruth, age 89, of Jefferson City, MO passed away peacefully Wednesday, October 11, 2023, at home surrounded by his family.

John was born on April 24, 1934, in Downing, MO, a son of John Raymond and Millie Pernie (Wheeler) Ruth.

Born and raised on his family farm in Schuyler County, John developed a strong work ethic from a young age.
