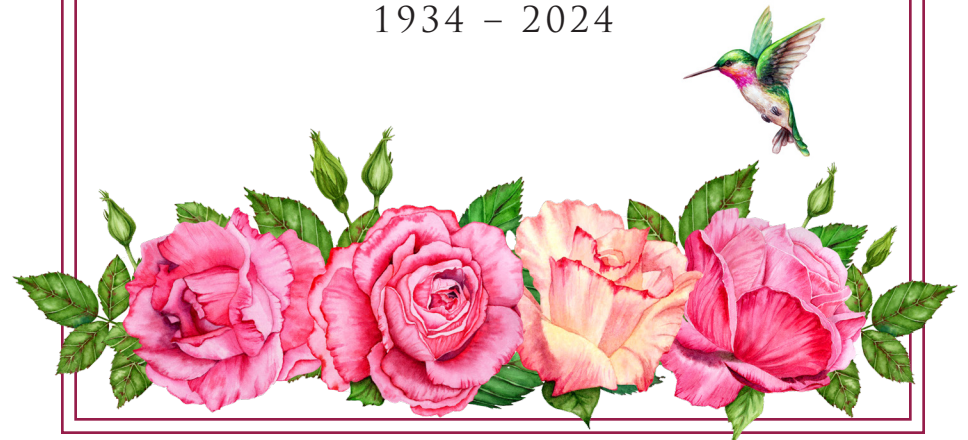

Remembering Loretta

Loretta Anna Siebeneck, age 89, of Jefferson City, Mo., passed away, Wednesday, March 6, 2024.

Loretta was born November 10, 1934, in Jefferson City, Mo., a daughter of Gerhard Henry and Adeline Marie (Toebben) Bemboom.

Loretta met the love of her life, Clifford John “Cliff” Siebeneck, at a dance in Osage Bend, Mo. Her mom made her wait one week after her 17th birthday before she got married. They were married on November 17, 1951, and blessed with 70 years of marriage until Cliff preceded her in death on May 9, 2022.

Loretta attended Immaculate Conception School and started working at Tweedy’s Shoe Factory at a young age. When her children were younger, she was a stay at home mom. Once they were old enough, she began employment at McGraw-Edison and eventually retired from Von Hoffmann Press. Her dedicated work spanned decades until her retirement in 1981, after which she joined Cliff in managing his sawmill business.

Loretta has been a longtime member of St. Stanislaus Church and prayer was part of her daily routine.

Her talents knew no bounds; Loretta found joy in painting ceramics, and she lovingly crafted village and nativity scenes for each of her children. Beyond ceramics, her creativity blossomed in quilt making and various other crafts. Above all, Loretta treasured the time she spent with her beloved family. One of Loretta’s greatest joys was dancing with her husband to country music and their perfect unison was admired by many and even captured in a picture in the News Tribune while they were dancing at the Cole County Sheriff’s Barbeque, June 9, 1999. They shared many cherished memories of travel to Arizona, Michigan, Utah, Wyoming, and even Canada. Fishing outings at the family lake were cherished memories.
